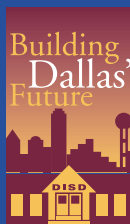

Moving into a brand new 91,000-sq.-ft. facility is exciting for students and teachers. That's particularly true when their new campus is a spacious two-story learning environment with a cafeteria, gym and specialized art and science classrooms overlooking a courtyard.

As one of the newest members of the Dallas Independent School District family of schools, Highland Meadows Elementary School was ready for students as the 2004-2005 school year began. On August 16, 2004, more than 600 students and 69 teachers and support staff began a new phase of their educational journey with high expectations.

The \$9 million facility includes:

- a two-story lobby opening into a library/media center
- a multi-purpose auditorium
- 39 classrooms
- a music room
- two computer labs
- numerous meeting rooms
- a parent center

Built to relieve Martha Turner Reilly Elementary School, Highland Meadows Elementary serves a growing area of northeast Dallas. In the 1970s, the site was the location of an annex school for Martha Turner Reilly Elementary. When Reilly was expanded under the bond program of 1992, the district leased the property to the City of Dallas and it was converted into a park.

Close to a major crossroads of Dallas, near Northwest Highway and Loop 635, the neighborhood Highland Meadows Elementary serves is steeped in the tradition where parent and child often graduate from the same schools.

Now, thanks to Dallas voters who approved the 2002 Bond Program, the community has a new school in which to be proud.

The 2002 Bond Program

Dallas voters have supported every DISD bond proposal put before them. The voters continued their support in 2002 by approving a \$1.37 billion bond program. Highland Meadows Elementary is one of the first two new schools to open under the 2002 bond program. Under the program, DISD will construct 21 new schools, an athletic complex and a central food preparation facility and will expand or renovate all existing schools.
