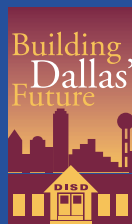

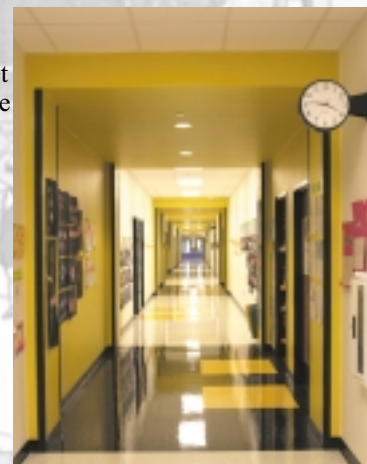
Introducing Your New Neighborhood School

History

Rosemont Elementary School opened in 1922 to serve its fast-growing North Oak Cliff community.

For the first few years, students attended Rosemont through the eighth grade and then moved on to Oak Cliff High (now W.H. Adamson High School). When Sunset High School was completed in 1925, Rosemont students were promoted to that school, as they are today.

During the 1970s Rosemont Elementary was converted to accommodate an open classroom environment, but by the mid-1980s plans were under way to return to individual classrooms, a project that was completed as part of a renovation program in 1987.

While the new Rosemont Primary School-Chris V. Semos Campus was being completed, renovations to Rosemont Elementary were also under way. The work included adding an elevator, a separate library and computer lab.

The Rosemont Primary School-Chris V. Semos Campus will accommodate kindergarten through second grade, and the newly renovated original building will serve fifth-grade and sixth-grade students.

Chris V. Semos

Chris Victor Semos was a dedicated public servant, a successful businessman and an advocate for Dallas' public schools.

Dallas natives, the Semos family owned and operated The Torch Restaurant in Oak Cliff for three decades.

In 1966, Chris Semos was elected to the Texas Legislature, where he served 16 years and was known as "Dean of the Dallas Delegation."

In 1982, voters elected him Dallas County Commissioner. He served in that position until 1994.

His civic activities included service to United Way, Dallas Community of Churches, Baylor College of Dentistry, National Conference of Christians and Jews, Dallas Family Hospital, Dallas Historical Society, Northwood University, and many other organizations. Semos received civic awards for service from organizations such as Dallas Baptist University, League of United Latin American Citizens, North Central Texas Council of Governments, Texas Restaurant Association, Scottish Rite Hospital, Dallas Assembly, the Greek Orthodox Church, and Oak Cliff Lions Club.

His wife, Anastasia "Tasie" Semos, taught in the Dallas Independent School District, and their three daughters attended Rosemont and graduated from the DISD.

The 2002 Bond Program

Dallas voters have supported every DISD bond proposal put before them. The voters continued their support in 2002 by approving a \$1.37 billion bond program. Under the program, DISD is building 21 new schools, an athletic complex and a central food preparation facility, and will expand or renovate all existing schools.

Other DISD facilities that opened in 2005 include:
